A verse to Memorize:

'Jesus replied, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry again. Whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.' (John 6:35 NLT)

<u>Luke 11:1-13</u>

What did the disciples ask Jesus? What did the story of the bread have to do with this? What are we supposed to do? Why are we supposed to do that? What does this passage tell us about who God is? How can you be encouraged or challenged by this?

Matthew 16:1-12

What was demanded from Jesus? How did Jesus initially respond to these people? What did the disciples argue about? What did Jesus say about that? What does this passage tell us about who God is? How can you be encouraged or challenged by this?
